When it comes to encouraging our teenagers to step outside their comfort zones, Youth Group is a great resource. Teens should be challenged by a strong community to improve themselves. Sense of Purpose: Teens who are characterized by strong levels of gratitude, compassion, and tenacity are more likely to develop a sense of purpose. Covid Corner

Bivalent Booster—I ran across this interesting update from Johns
Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. Bivalent Booster is for longest term protection against the original and omicron strains of the spike proteins variant. CDC recommends for those 5 years old and older, 2 months after your last Covid-19 vaccination or 3 months since you've had Covid.

Why? It prevents sickness and if you do get ill, you may be less ill, recover faster and avoid Hospitalization.

BEST Team Recycling, Sunday, January 1

Here's recycling we welcome:

- We are no longer accepting Styrofoam!
- We are no longer accepting any #6 plastics!
- Air pillows (Bonnie takes to UPS)
- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Batteries Candle wax (the Prickett family will use)



Please Note: #1 plastic TUBS can go curbside. Other CLEAR #1 plastics can now be recycled at New Seasons at Orenco Station and at events such as James' Recycling, but not on First Sunday. (**Note**: we will accept #1 CLEAR plastics starting this Sunday, Dec. 4.)

New! We are now accepting #1 CLEAR plastics on First Sundays. Please bring clear, clean, and dry plastic packaging, including clamshells, tubs, and lids. We're also accepting paktech plastic six pack caps, and corks. We will take them to New Seasons for you.

Be sure to check recycling # on your plastics before delivering them to church, and make sure everything is CLEAN. THANK YOU!

We are no longer accepting any packing materials except air pillows, and no planting pots.

<u>Trash</u>: Frozen food containers, six-pack rings (cut up), soft or crumbly Styrofoam-like materials, other plastics that cannot go in the curbside bin.

When in doubt, throw it out, to avoid contamination of other recyclables

We accept any time (in the boxes over the coat racks):

- Cell phones (You can also take phone back to the store where it was purchased.)
- Printer cartridges (the church gets cash for these, or they can go back to the store where purchased.)

Batteries: Alkaline batteries can be placed in the trash as they are not considered toxic waste. So, if your battery says "alkaline" on it, Metro recommends you simply put it in the garbage. Other batteries are considered toxic, so please do not throw them in the garbage, but instead bring them to your FGUCC BEST Team for proper disposal at Metro. We will accept other batteries that are considered toxic, including hearing aid, lithium, normal and heavy duty as well as rechargeable. If in doubt, bring all batteries to us on first Sunday and we will sort them out.

Special Notes: If you're dropping off batteries, CFL's, fluorescent tubes or items for Metro please fill out the sheet provided for Metro.

New Kitchen Report

The newly formed Kitchen Committee is up and "cooking!" Consisting of about a dozen volunteers, its charter is to put together a nuts-and-bolts proposal (including equipment specification & pricing and contractor proposals & bids) which will implement the kitchen-related goals for FGUCC ministry springing out of the year-long visioning process. These goals include the ability to:

- 1. Handle cooking for several hundred people, including food insecurity outreach,
- 2. Function as a teaching kitchen for community classes, and possible partnership with Pacific University.
- 3. Be used or rented for catered venues, e.g., weddings & funerals,
- 4. Be rented by businesses, both established and startups,
- 5. Be available to the Rural Youth Support Coalition in developing a youth drop-in center, and to other potential community partners.

To achieve these goals, the space must meet the requirements of a commercial kitchen. So, the committee has already visited multiple commercial kitchens in the local area for ideas and answers to questions arising from our research. In addition to a unifying passion for empowering this aspect of our church's ministry, members bring with them a wide spectrum of kitchen experience and expertise.

The Kitchen Committee is pressing forward to complete our proposal as soon as feasible and present it to the Finance and Property (F&P) committee for its input & action, and after that to the Executive Board. In the meantime, we will regularly update the congregation about our work.
