Dear friends,

This newsletter is titled, "The Viewpoint," and so I would like to share one of my own personal viewpoints this month. We find a loud call to economic justice at the heart of the message of the prophets and the gospel of Jesus Christ. Acts points to how the early Christians shared all things in common as an expression of discipleship and a way of welcoming the realm of God in our midst. Matthew 25 invites us see the poorest of the poor as the presence of the living Christ and meet the Living Christ in the work of uplifting each other out of all forms of poverty. The United States of America stands among the wealthiest nations in the world and yet our public infrastructure which includes our systems of healthcare, housing, livable wages, food, and public education continue to crumble. Big moneyed interests continue to undermine the establishment of the public welfare and the common good. Our country refuses to tax billionaires and those in the highest income brackets to maintain a civil society. Our seeming unwillingness and/or inability to defend the commons continues to erase the middle class, further impoverish the average citizen, and maintain an immoral economic status quo where the few profit exponentially at the expense of the welfare of the majority. As witnesses to the gospel, we can remind each other that we can always do something about it together because, "we know that the LORD maintains the cause of the needy, and executes justice for the poor in court." (-Psalm 140:12)

One local microcosmic expression of this overarchingly unjust picture is how homeowners and business owners are expected to pay for the maintenance of property belonging to the local municipalities for which we are already taxed. Currently the church is being asked to pay for the funding of the removal and replacement of the trees and sidewalk repairs on College Way. The low bid for the total cost of this project, including tree removal and stump grinding is \$26,412, and the high bid is \$48,500. This exorbitant amount of money is more than most people make in

an entire year. To ask an individual homeowner, let alone a business, let alone a church... to pay this kind of money is to squeeze blood from a stone. If the church had that kind of extra money, we would also do better to put it toward helping the growing number of unhoused people who can't afford to live in this non-functioning economy. In fact, just recently, we put a large sum of money toward our kitchen project which will enable us to continue to offer a meal plan for the growing number of people in need. These are the sorts of efforts we actually need to be supporting with our resources as a church. Unfortunately, as the law stands, the homeowner or the business is indeed expected to pay in most municipalities for sidewalk repairs. It has been truthfully acknowledged that the process of changing the law would be swimming upstream, and yet following the gospel has also been likened to swimming upstream. We can take to heart Dr. King's words as a friendly reminder these days when he said, "One has not only a legal but a moral responsibility to obey just laws. Conversely, one has a moral responsibility to disobey unjust laws. Any law that uplifts human personality is just. Any law that degrades human personality is unjust." In planting trees on College Way the church was conforming to the city's prescribed plan. As followers of Jesus we are called to be advocates for economic justice. I would like to advocate in that way by suggesting the viewpoint that expecting individuals or small businesses to pay such exorbitant amounts for repairs of property owned by the city is not only unjust but also makes no sense. The idea that the city's sidewalks wouldn't be funded and maintained in a good state by the city is also ableist. Even if this is the way things are in most places, regarding this issue or other potential instances of economic injustice, how do we help each other, and our neighbors do better in Forest Grove? Frankly I think that Public Works should pay for the public sidewalk that they own. If we can't change the law, how do we at least advocate and work to build a community where we cooperate more together to take care of what we share in common? So that's a mid-summer's viewpoint for discussion! These are important questions we can be asking ourselves as followers of Jesus.



# Remembering Ralph Brown.

This month I am recommending two very different books.

<u>Travelers to Unimaginable Lands</u>, Stories of Dementia, the Caregiver, and the Human Brain. This book is a number one best seller, by Dasha Kiper.

"These 'moving and often surprising' case histories meld science and storytelling to illuminate the complex relationship between the mind of someone with dementia and the mind of the person caring for them. (*The Wall Street Journal*)

<u>Loving someone who has dementia</u>, How to Find Hope while Coping with Stress and Grief, by Pauline Boss, PhD.

Nearly half of U.S. citizens over the age of 85 are suffering from some kind of dementia and require care. Loving someone who has dementia is a new kind of caregiving book. It's not about the usual techniques, but about how to manage on-going stress and grief. The book is for caregivers, family members, friends, neighbors as well as educators and professionals—anyone touched by the epidemic of dementia. Dr. Boss helps caregivers find hope in "ambiguous loss"—having a loved one both here and not here, physically present but psychologically absent.



# **BEST Team First Sunday for July 2**

#### At this time, we only accept the following items on First Sunday:

- ✓ Clear #1 plastics
- ✓ Air pillows
- ✓ Corks
- ✓ PakTech handles for carrying 4-6 pack cans
- ✓ Candle wax (the Prickett Family uses)
- ✓ Ink cartridges



#### Update on battery and CFL bulb recycling from the BEST Team



Recycling batteries is very confusing. We'll try to simplify it. You can recycle your own batteries, or **you can bring all of them to church on First Sunday and we'll sort and dispose of them properly for you**. If you bring them to us, please contribute to the recycling fees.

All batteries and fluorescent bulbs and tubes can be taken to the Metro Central Hazardous Waste Facility on an individual basis.

**Alkaline** (**AAA**, **AA**, **A**, **C**, **D**, **9** volt): Are safe to go in the trash. Best if they're in a bag or box together, with 9 volts taped on the terminal end. Can be recycled at Batteries Plus\* for \$1.50 a pound (they extract the aluminum from them).

**Lithium** (like alkaline, but last longer): Can be recycled at Batteries Plus\* for \$.50 a pound.

Button Cell: Can be recycled at Batteries Plus\* for \$.50 a pound (some are safe to throw in the trash).

**Lithium-ion** (rechargeable, in cell phones, tablets, laptops, electric cars, electric bikes, electric yard tools): Can be recycled at Batteries Plus\* for \$.50 a pound. Can also be recycled free at Ace Hardware in Forest Grove, Home Depot (up to 11#) and Lowe's (up to 11#).

**Lead acid (commonly used in cars, wheelchairs, trolling motors and RV cycles)**: Can be recycled at Batteries Plus\* for \$.50 a pound. Can also be recycled free at the Forest Grove Transfer Station and Computer Drive Connection in Cornelius.

**CFL bulbs**: Can be recycled at Batteries Plus\* for \$.99 each or at Home Depot and Lowe's for free (no tubes).

\*Batteries Plus will recycle 5# of batteries free with a purchase.
